Summer Fun Carnival

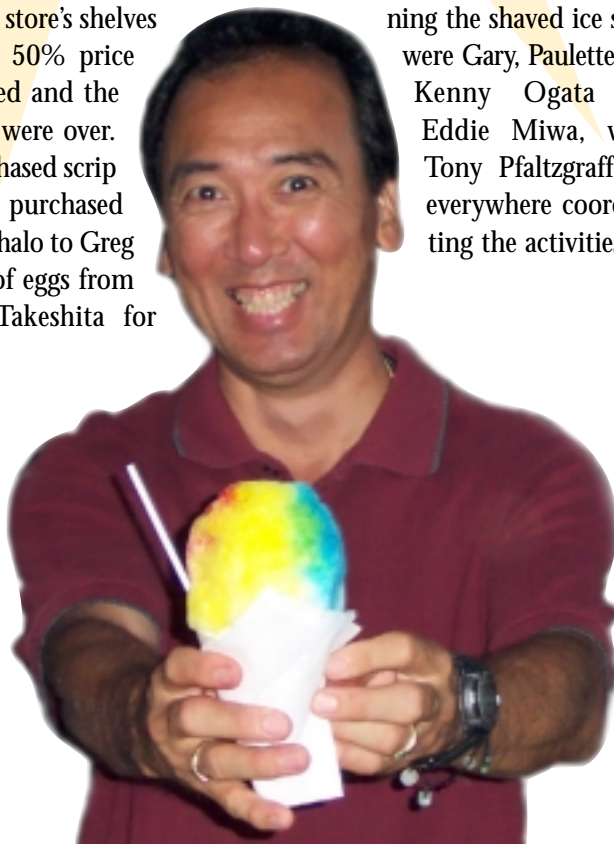

Thought For Today

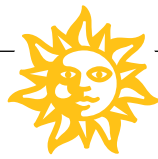
Today is the beginning of a new day. God has given me this day to use as I will.

The district will receive 70% of the pre-sale tickets sold and 70% of the gross sales from the food booth and shave ice stand. YMCA staff will be heavily involved in manning game booths during the 3 days. The District will use the net proceeds from the Y's Men's efforts for the Kids To Camp project. Every club member is needed for this project, so all members are urged to set aside time for this important project.

District meetings have been set for August 13, March 10, and April 28 during the coming program year.

Club Meeting Notes

A proposed budget was presented to club members by Treasurer Dick Wong. Members were asked to review this and be prepared to vote on the budget at the next meeting. The club voted to include \$200 a year for the next 5 years for the YMCA Capital Fund. Members were informed that the Metro District clubs have committed themselves to supporting the Nissan Family Fair to be held on August 15–17. Members need to turn out in force to be able to man a food booth and shave ice stand for the 3 day period. The

dues credit system was adjusted to include member's attendance at district, regional and other Y's Men's events. Greg Lee presented the club with the Regional Award certificate for the areas of Membership, Club Bulletin, Community Service and YMCA Service. The annual Casino Nite will be held on Friday, October 17, at Tony and Charlene's home in Alewa. Thanks go to Ed Sato, Greg Lee, Sunny and Norma Young, and Bev and Dick Wong for helping out in the Taste of Honolulu Project. ▼

REGIONAL NEWS

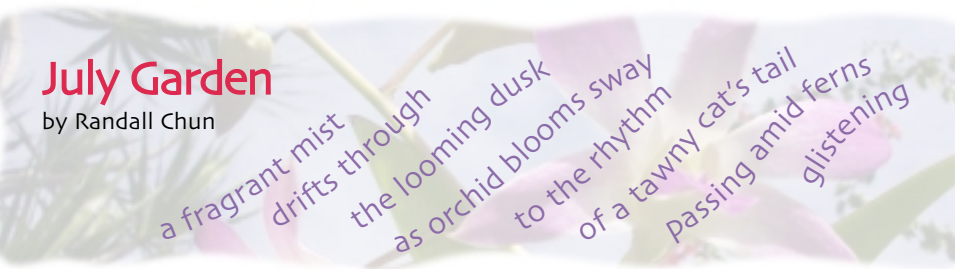

This year, 24 teams practice twice a week in preparation for games on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. also teaches teens important lessons in discipline, reliability and self control.

In early July, Charlee Malott attended the annual Weinberg Foundation "Christmas in July." The Kalihi YMCA was fortunate to receive a \$10,000 gift that will go towards supporting this year's Late Night League. Any funds left over will be spent on the 2004 league.
